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1 TK8 Safe

1.1 Description

TK8 Safe is a perfect password manager with features that covers all aspects of storing and using sensitive information.

If you have passwords, then TK8 Safe can make your life easier.

You can keep all user names, passwords, secret notes and serial numbers in one secured database file. The file is encrypted and not available to anyone else than you.

It means no more lost passwords and headache remembering them. No more fears strangers can see or use your information. It's safe and simple!

TK8 Safe password manager not only stores your information, but also helps you to use it. Nice and fast user interface makes it easy to find required information quickly. You can also use folders in your files to group the information. Searching, sorting and finding passwords has never been easier.

Log in to password protected web pages automatically! Just select "Auto-type" from the menu or press system wide hot key on the login prompt. The program will locate the required entry automatically and fills the login prompt for you.

If needed, you can also launch web pages related with password entries and use classic Copy and Paste commands.

The password file can be locked if you leave the room, so the information remains always protected. Even if you forget to lock the file, the program will do this automatically after unused for some time.

Advanced users have many options and additional features like encryption options, same-time multi-user access, custom fields for each entry, automatic password backups, recycle bin, favorites, etc.. By using system wide hot keys you can call different TK8 Safe commands whatever other program is active, built in password generator can be useful on creating new secure passwords, etc.

If you like, you can use the program in the system tray mode. In this way no room is taken away from your taskbar. And you can still access all the features easily by clicking on the tray icon (next to the Windows system clock).

The program is also portable, which means you can run it directly from any removable media like USB memory discs. So you can carry your file and the program in the pocket, knowing only you can access the information.

Help file and manual are included with the program so you could get to know all the features and benefits TK8 Safe can offer.

1.2 Features

Top 5 features current users love most:

1.3 Standard vs. Professional

Professional version has all the features of Standard version, plus:

- Possibility to use different encryption algorithms (instead of default AES 256)
- Onscreen keyboard for entering database master password
- Synchronization
- Login Groups
- Access to the file with multiple sessions (same-time multiuser access).
- Option to email login info (on different templates, if required)
- History log feature where you can see every change made in the database
- Templates to load default field names (and values) to login entry additional fields
- File Operations module to encrypt and decrypt external files. Secure Delete function for external files
- User permission system (access restrictions to different folders and feature based restrictions)

1.4 Security

By default TK8 Safe uses AES encryption algorithm to protect your data file.

AES stands for Advanced Encryption Standard. It is a symmetric key encryption technique which will replace the commonly used Data Encryption Standard (DES). It was the result of a worldwide call for submissions of encryption algorithms issued by the US Government's [National Institute of Standards and Technology \(NIST\)](#) in 1997 and completed in 2000. The winning algorithm, Rijndael, was developed by two Belgian cryptologists, Vincent Rijmen and Joan Daemen.

AES provides strong encryption and has been selected by NIST as a Federal Information Processing

Standard in November 2001 ([FIPS-197](#)), and in June 2003 the U.S. Government (NSA) [announced](#) that **AES is secure enough to protect classified information up to the TOP SECRET level**, which is the highest security level and defined as information which would cause "exceptionally grave damage" to national security if disclosed to the public.

The Standard version uses AES 256-bit keys to protect database files. That is a combination of superb security and fast encryption. In the Professional version you can use additional encryption algorithms like BlowFish with 448 bit keys, Twofish, Square, etc.

2 Quick start tutorial

2.1 Starting the program

After the program is installed, you can start TK8 Safe in several ways:

- 1) From Start menu Programs folder, select TK8 Safe folder and click on the TK8 Safe icon.
- 2) If the TK8 Safe icon is on the desktop, you can run the shortcut by double-clicking on its icon.
- 3) TK8 Safe has also file association with files having TKS extension (File type). It means that when you double-click on some TK8 Safe database file, the program is started and the program will open that file (of course the master password is required if the file is password protected).

2.2 Creating a new file

To start keeping your information in the secure database, you have to create a new TK8 Safe file.

To do this, click on the "File" menu and select "New..."

On the appearing dialog enter the file name and click 'Save'

2.3 File properties

File properties window is opened automatically when creating a new file.

Later, after the file is created, you can change your file properties by opening File menu and selecting Properties. You will be asked for a password to access this information.



General info

On the General info panel you can set the descriptive title to your file and enter the master password that protects your file. This password is required every time the file is accessed or opened. To set the password you want to use, just enter it to the "Database password" field. To prevent typing errors, please verify the password by typing it also to the "Confirm ..." field.

If you leave the password fields empty, your file will not be password protected. This might be good only when you are sure no one else than you can access your computer and the file -or- the file contains no sensitive information. Though, we strongly suggest you to password protect any file.

WARNING: Please make sure you do not forget the master password! If you lose it there is no possibility to access your information in the file. Even we are unable to get any information from the file so we can not help you when the master password is forgotten.

In the Professional version, you can also select the preferred file encryption method.

Settings

On the Settings tab how many records should the program keep in the history table. That is the amount of commands you can undo or watch and revert in the history log. Additionally, you can set which actions exactly should be kept in the history log.

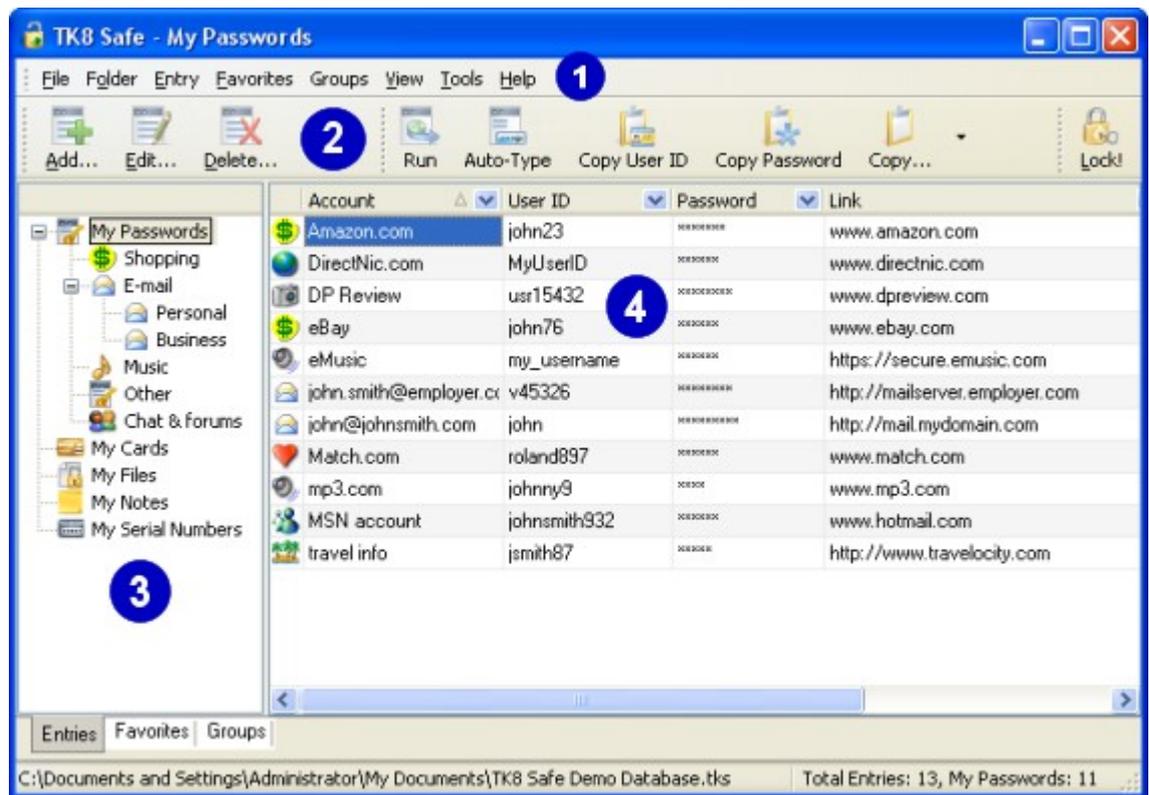
Users & Permissions (available in the Professional version only)

If you want to set up permission system for your file, meaning you can set which user has the access to the file and to what kind of information, you can set it on this panel. You can read more about user permission system from the chapter "User permissions".

2.4 User Interface

2.4.1 Layout

TK8 Safe has an easy to understand user interface you can see below:



You can use the main menu (1) and buttons on the toolbar (2) to access commands and different program modules. Every password database file you created with TK8 Safe can have different folders and sub folders (3). Each folder can have unlimited amount of entries, which are seen in the entry list (4).

In addition you can right-click with your mouse on the folder tree (3) or in the entry list (4) to open different pop up menus.

You will find more information about TK8 Safe by reading through the following chapters.

2.4.2 Folders

Folders are good in case you want to keep information grouped in your file.

By default your file has some folders inside when you create it, but the number of folders is not limited. So you can have as much folders as you need, and delete those you do not want any more.

You can manage folders at any time opening the "Folder" selection in the main menu. When you add or edit a folder, the folder detail window appears:



When adding a folder, you can select the folder type. Depending of the folder type you can keep different kind of information about the entries on that folder.

TK8 Safe has 5 different form designs built in to keep your information:

- Logins - to keep most of the login information
- Cards - to keep sensitive information about your credit, membership, and other cards.
- Files - to keep files securely inside your password database.
- Notes - to keep secure notes about your stuff
- Serials - to keep serial numbers of the software (and / or hardware) you have.

Please read the next chapter "Entries" to see exactly what values those different type of entries can keep.

Additionally to type, you can select the icon for your folder, and finally enter its name.

TK8 Safe has a feature to show all records, including those from the sub-folders, when the folder is selected. For this to work, you need to select "Yes" option to the last field on the Folder Properties window. This feature is good when you have a lot of entries in different sub folders but often forget to which folder the entry was added to. If this feature is activated, you can always find the entry from the root folder entry list, but at the same time your data remains well organized.

Changing folder location and order

At any time you can change your folder structure and locations. For this just use your mouse and drag the folder you need to the preferred location. Additionally, you can use Order submenu from the Folder menu. That allows you to select which criteria is used to sort your entire folder tree, or if you would like to use the custom order:



That menu selection also helps you to move the selected folder one step up or down, and move it a level higher in the tree if needed.

2.4.3 Entries

To add, edit or delete your user names, passwords and other information, you can use the "Entry" menu or the buttons on the toolbar:



When you add or edit entries, entry detail window appears where you can fill the fields with information you want to keep about your entry. As you might know already, depending the type of selected folder, you can store different kind of information on your entries.

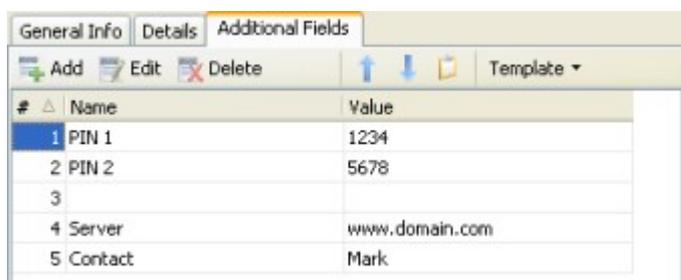
Login entries

If the folder type is Logins, the entry detail window looks like this:

This type is good for storing any kind of user names and passwords. On the detail window you can point out the account name, user name, password, and the web site address (for example) on the link field.

You can also enter or select the additional description and notes about your entry if you like.

In case you need to store values for more fields, you can do this on the Additional Fields panel:

On this table you can store any kind of field values, on unlimited records. Similar to entries table, you can use Add, Edit and Delete buttons to manage records. In the professional version you can additionally use Templates to load pre-typed fields and values.

On the main window, when you select the entry which has additional fields, the program will automatically displays additional table at the bottom of the screen, with the field names and values. You can manage access those values quickly when you right click on that appearing table.

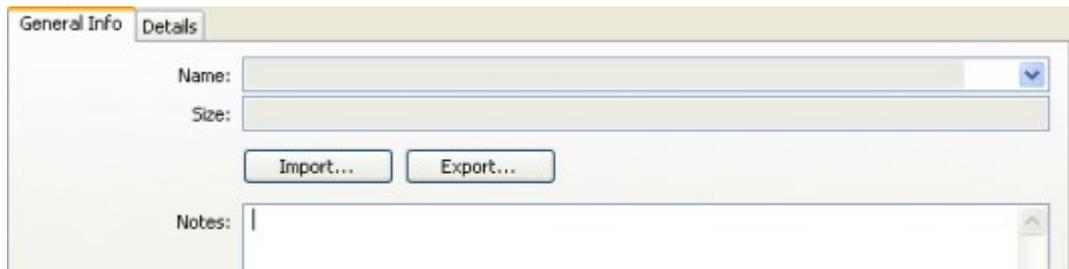
Card entries

When the selected folder has type Cards, the entry detail window looks like this:



It is specially designed so you could store any kind of card information in the best way.

File entries are a bit different that other entries. They allow you to import any external file inside to your database:



When you import a file inside to your database, it is protected along with your passwords, and the file is always with you, as long as you have your file. When you need to access the file, you can use Export button on the window, and select the location where you would like to save the file.

Note entries are best for you if you want to store some memos, for example, but want to make sure nobody else has access to them. In such cases, you can just create a new folder for your secret notes:



Serial Number folder type:

Most computer users have bought some software or hardware. In many cases the software has license numbers, certificates, and other information that is also a proof of the purchase. It is easy to lose such information, except keeping it in one place. TK8 Safe has special form designed to keep your serial numbers:



When you store all your serial numbers inside your database, you can always access this information fast should you re-install the program or request support from companies that require order numbers from you to get support.

Details panel on Entry window

Each entry window has also the Details panel. Depending the entry type, you can keep different

information there. For example you can store a photo of your card, see previous passwords of your login entry, or change its Auto-Type template. You can also see when the entry was created (in multi-user system also who created it), and when was it modified last time. Additionally you can select the record and text color if you like.

2.4.4 Organizing icons and selection lists

Icons

Each entry and folder in your file can have an icon. When you open entry detail window, at right of its title field (Account or Name), you can see a small drop down button. When you click on it, the menu appears from where you can select the icon you like. When creating a new folder, or editing old one, you will see a separate field for selecting the icon.

By default when you create a new database file it already has a set of icons ready for you. But you can change this list. For this, open the File menu and select "Organize Icon List". The window appears where you can add new icons, or delete them from the list. When adding new icons, the file has to be in BMP or ICO file format. The default size used for the icon is 16 x 16 pixels.

Selection list values

In several places in the program you can select pre-typed text with your mouse instead of typing it. This is faster if you want to use similar values in some fields on a lot of entries. For example you can have pre-made selections for entry description field, with values "Email account", "Personal account" or "Business account".

To add and manage those selection values, open the File menu and select "Organize Selection Lists". When you add or edit a selection record, you can point out on which field the value should be available for selection, and what exactly should be the selectable value.

You can edit and delete available selections at any time. When you edit or delete some of the selections, the text already selected to the entries will remain unchanged and is also not removed. If you want this, you need to edit these records and remove or change the values manually.

2.4.5 Using your entries

Soon your file contains some entries, you can start using them easily. As all your user names and passwords are in the one place, you can find them quickly and there is no threat you will forget them.

If you need to log in to some web page, then probably the easiest is to just locate the entry of that web page and copy the password (by using the Entry menu or the toolbar buttons). After copied, the password can be pasted to the login window.

When you open the "Entry" menu, you will see many different commands to manage your entries. You will find detailed information about those commands from the chapter "Main functions".

2.5 Saving a file

The program is saving your file automatically after each change. So there is no special "Save" command available. That ensures you will never lose your changes and new information if you forget to save your file.

When saving your file, the program is also making a backup copies of your data. By default (set in options) the number of old files kept is three. So should something happen to your latest file (like corruption due to virus), you can always access one of the latest backups. You can read more about this in Program options / Other chapter.

Additionally, in program options you can set additional location where you want to keep your main file for backup reasons.

2.6 Opening a file

When you close the program then next time you start it, it is set to open the recent used file automatically. Of course the master password is required to access the information.

To open some other file, you can use "File" menu "Open" command.

Also, it is possible to set other file to open at the program startup. You can read more about this in the Program Options topic.

When opening the file and the password is required, you can also use on-screen keyboard to enter your database password (available in the Pro version). To bring up on-screen keyboard, click on the blue keyboard icon at right on the password field.

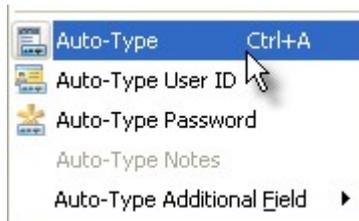
2.7 Portability - the program and your file

You can carry your file and the program with you, on the portable devices like USB memory keys, flash cards, etc. More information about how to put the program and the file to your device, please read the chapter "Working from portable (USB) devices".

3 Main functions

3.1 Auto-Type commands

Auto-Type is the command you can use to automatically fill in login prompts. It is available in the Entry menu and when you open the right click popup menu:



and also in the toolbar:



Using Auto-Type command

The first, and probably the easiest way to use Auto-Type is this: When you are on the web site that requires you to enter your user name and password, click on the first field that you have to fill in there (usually user name). When the cursor is blinking on that field, start (or activate) TK8 Safe. Once your entries are on the screen, just find the appropriate entry and click the Auto-Type button on the toolbar (or use menu commands). That's it - the web site is activated and your fields are now filled.

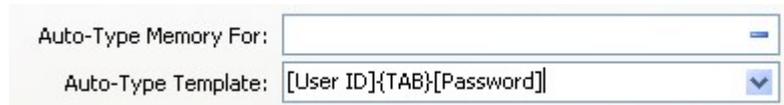
If you want or need, you can also auto-type only some of the field values. For this open the Entry menu (or right click popup menu) and select the single field value you want to send to the last active page.

Another great way to use Auto-Type: System Wide Hotkey

A very convenient way to use Auto-Type is to hit its hotkey combination (by default CTRL+ALT+A) whenever you are on the web site that requires your login info. Again, when the cursor is blinking on the first login field, just press the hotkey on the keyboard. When doing this first time on that page, TK8 Safe will pop up and asks you to select the entry for that page. Just select it and click Auto-Type button on the toolbar. Now, whenever you press the hotkey next time on that same web site, the program already knows which entry was selected last time and fills in the fields with that entry information automatically. So the only thing you have to do is to press the hotkey.

When the entry selection window appears first time you use hotkey on the web site, and you don't want to remember the connection between the selected entry and the page, uncheck the option "Remember record selection for Auto-Type Memory" before hitting the Auto-Type button.

If you want to clear the connection between the entry and the web site, please locate the entry you need, and edit it. On the Details panel you will see the field "Auto-Type Memory For:". Clear that field by pressing the "-" button at right of the field and save the entry.

If you have more than one identity (several entries) for some web site, and you want to use the hotkey method to fill in the page, you can do this (though the program remembers the first entry filled on the page). Once the connection between one of the entries and the page has been remembered, find and edit that entry. On the entry Details panel, copy the "Auto-Type Memory" field value to the clipboard (by selecting the whole field and pressing CTRL+C). Then, edit another entry you want to use on that page. On the entry Details panel, activate the "Auto-Type Memory" field, and paste the previously copied page title (with CTRL+V). When you now save the entry, and press the hotkey next time on that web site, the program asks you which entry from those two you would like to use currently. The number of entries you can set up for one page in such way is not limited.

Selecting Auto-Type from system tray menu

When TK8 Safe is in the system tray mode, you can open the tray menu by clicking on the TK8 Safe icon. Selecting Auto-Type from the menu is exactly the same as pressing Auto-Type hotkey on the web site. So in case you prefer to work with the mouse, you can use that method for convenient auto filling that remembers the connection between the page and the entry.

Customizing Auto-Type templates *(for advanced users)*

With TK8 Safe advanced users can also customize the information that is filled in on the login page (for each entry). By default Auto-Type is filling in the "User ID" and "Password" values. What the program is doing, is that it emulates keyboard key presses, meaning that once the User ID field is filled, it hits the TAB key (to move to the next field) and then enters the password. So the default template looks like this: "[USER ID]{TAB}[Password]".

To change the template, you can just edit the "Auto-Type Template" field on entry Details panel. There you can remove any current fields and keys. To add new key press or fields that should be sent to the login page, click on the dropdown button at right of the field. From the appearing menu select what key or field should be.

For example, if the login page has three fields you have to fill: your user name, password, and your account (domain) name; and additionally you don't want to hit the Login button each time on that page yourself, you can create the following template doing everything you need:

[User ID]{TAB}[Password]{TAB}[Account]{ENTER}
```

Known problem

If you are using Internet Explorer 7, and Auto-type function fails on your computer, please follow the directions below to change the setting that prevents Auto-type from working. If Auto-type works, you don't have to change this setting. This setting is designed for East Asian languages. If you are not using those languages, you can change it without any worries. You can also restore the original state at any time.

- 1) Using the Windows Start button, open **Control Panel**.
- 2) Open „**Regional and Language Options**”.
- 3) Click on the „**Languages**” panel name, to activate that panel.
- 4) Click the **Details** button you see.
- 5) Activate the **Advanced** panel.
- 6) Check the option „**Turn off advanced text services**”.
- 7) Click **OK**.

Auto-type should work after that. If it still fails, please let us know.

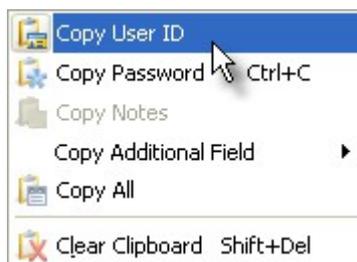
3.2 Clipboard (Copy) commands

With "copy" commands you can store the information in the Windows clipboard. Once copied there, you can use it later on some other window (like on some login page field), by using the Paste commands. To paste the data from clipboard, you can press Ctrl+V on the keyboard.

Clipboard commands are available on the toolbar:



and also in the Entry menu and right click popup menus:



Copy buttons are available also on the entry detail windows, at right of the edit fields:



By clicking those copy buttons on the fields, the value of that field is copied to the clipboard.

The clipboard is automatically cleared after a certain period set in program options (by default 5 minutes). That ensures no sensitive information is left to the clipboard for a longer time. If you want, you can also clear the clipboard manually, by opening the Entry menu and selecting "Clear clipboard".

3.3 Run

Run command will execute the link related with currently selected entry, for example a web site or a file. The appropriate web site is always opened in the new browser window.

To run the link, you can use the Toolbar button or the Entry menu:



You can associate the link to any entry you have, on the entry details window:



In addition to web sites, you can select files and programs as links. For this you can use the yellow "open" button at right on the Link field. That allows you to select the file from your computer. Additionally, advanced users can enter parameters for running programs.

System tray and hotkey

Run command has also the system wide hotkey available (by default CTRL+ALT+R). When you press this combination on your keyboard, no matter what other window is currently active, TK8 Safe will ask you which web site you would like to open.

On the system tray mode, when you open TK8 Safe tray menu, you can also select Run command there. System tray Run command behaves similarly to the hotkey, allowing you to select the entry which web site you would like to open.

3.4 Lock

When you leave the desk and/or finish using the file, you can lock it without shutting down the program.

To lock the file, click the "Lock" button on the toolbar or use the same command from the File

menu:



If the file is locked and you want to unlock it, you can do this the same way you locked the file - just click on the checked "Lock" button on the toolbar. To unlock and access the information, you will be asked to enter the database file password, of course.

You do not have to worry if you forget the file open, because it is locked automatically after unused for some time. The "lock after idle" time can be changed in the program options. By default the file is locked after 5 minutes unused.

3.5 Searching & sorting entries

Sorting entries

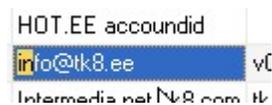
To sort entries on the list by some column, just click on the column header. A triangle appears showing the sort order. The second click on the already sorted column header will reverse the sorting order. So it is possible to sort entries ascending or descending, depending how you would like to see the list.



It is also possible to sort the entry list by more than one column. To add sorting to additional columns, hold down the SHIFT key on the keyboard when clicking on the additional column headers.

Quick search

To find some of your entries fast, you can just start typing on your keyboard and the closest entry is located immediately. The locate is made by the column that is currently active:



Advanced Find

For advanced find dialog, open the Tools menu and select "Find" (or press Ctrl + F on the keyboard).

On the appearing window can specify what you want to find (some text, numbers, anything), and

from which folders. There is no matter where on the field this value is located - at field start, center or end. If it is there, the Find command will find it.

To start the search, hit the Find button. After that the dialog closed and the matching entry located. To find the next matching entry, open the Tools menu and select "Find next" or hit F3 on your keyboard. You can repeat this until the program is telling you there are no more matches left.

To start the new search, open the Find dialog again, and specify what you would like to find...

3.6 Columns and sensitive info

Changing column position and size

Entry list on the main form has default widths and positions for every column. But this can be changed. To change the size of a column, move the mouse cursor to the end of the column title (header), until a cursor takes a sizing shape. Then click the left mouse button, hold it down and move the mouse to the left or right until you get the column width you want. Then release a mouse button.



To change the position of some column, left click on the column header and hold the mouse button down. Then move the column to the position you want and release the button.

The column setup for entry lists is remembered, so next time you use TK8 Safe, your customizations are loaded automatically.

Hiding sensitive info

If you do not want to show user names and / or passwords all the time on the entry list, you can mask them. Masking means that each letter, number and symbol is replaced with * character. It does not replace the real values on fields, of course, and is used only to show (and protect) sensitive information. To change field masks, open the "Sensitive Info Mask" submenu from the View menu. There you can select which fields are masked on the table and which ones are visible.

If the field is masked, it is masked also on the entry detail window. When you activate some of the masked fields on the entry detail, the field is unmasked temporarily, though, until you are on that field. That way you can see what exactly are you editing and typing on the field.

Adding / removing columns

After installed, TK8 Safe has a default set of columns in the entry list. If you want to add some columns you see on the entry detail window, but not present on the table, you can do this by opening the View menu and selecting "Customize columns...". That will open a small customization window, where you can see all the available columns currently not shown in the entry list. To add some column to your table, just click on it and hold down the mouse button until you drag it to the

entry list.

To hide some column, use the same customization window. For hiding just click on the column header and hold down the mouse button until you drag the column name back to the customization box.

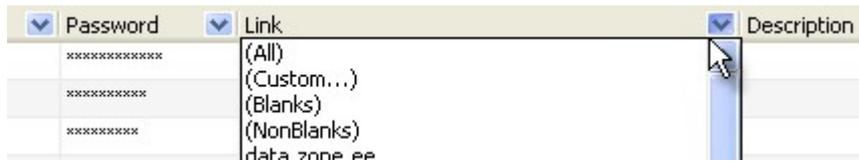
After the changes are done, you can close the customization form. The new layout is saved automatically.

3.7 Using filters and entry groups

Filters

Filters are useful in situations where you have a lot of entries in one folder and you need to see only those meeting some particular criteria. For example, if you want to see passwords expiring on March next year. Those entries not matching the filter criteria are hidden until you remove the filter.

To set a filter to the entry list, you can use filter dropdown button at right on the column header. Once clicked, you can select which value should be in common on the entries you want to see:



To create more flexible filter, click on the "(Custom...)" selection. After that the custom filter dialog appears with intuitive selections and descriptions. You can there select the condition (like equal, greater than, like, etc..) and type the value. It allows you to create filters where, for example, you will see only entries containing the "aa" in the field.

After the filter is selected or custom filter set, you can see the condition at the bottom of your entry table:



To remove (close) the filter, click on the red "X" button on the filter conditions panel.

Grouping entries

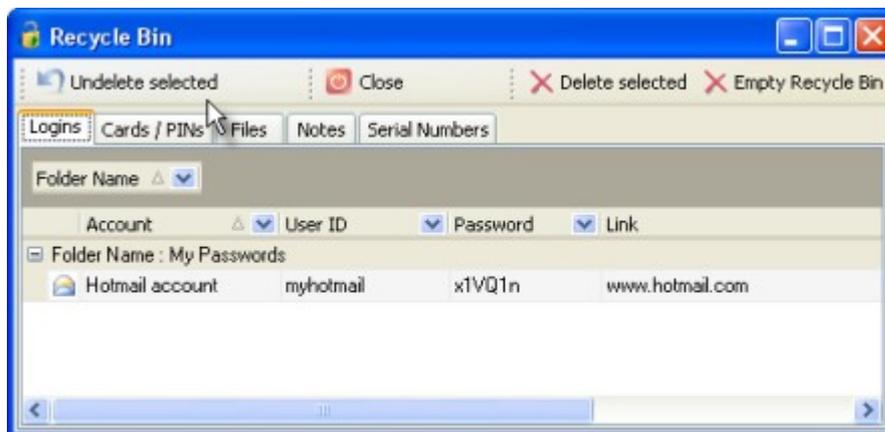
In addition to having entries divided to different folders, you can also use grouping features in TK8 Safe. Grouping is a way to display entries in the entry list. To enable grouping feature, please check the "Show Grouping Bar" option in the View menu. When it is checked, you will see a dark grey panel (grouping box) at the top of your entry list.

To group your entries, drag some column header (for example description, if you are using that field) to the grouping box area. The information is divided to groups, based on the values found in the field. You can extract and collapse groups by using the "+" and "-" buttons on the group titles (on the entry list). To remove grouping, please drag the column header back to the entry list. To hide the grouping box, use the View menu and uncheck the "Show Grouping Bar" option.

3.8 Undo and Recycle Bin

If you have deleted some entry by accident, or changed the value you didn't want to change, you can undo your past actions. For this, open the File menu and select Undo. The program will ask if you are sure about taking back your action or not. Even if you close the program meanwhile, the program remembers what you did last time and allows you to undo that days and months later.

Additionally, the program has Recycle Bin, where you can see all the deleted entries:



When you delete entries, they are not completely removed, but saved in the Recycle Bin. Just like when you delete your files in Windows. If you want to undelete some of your records, you can open the Recycle Bin, and select the entry you need to restore. Once selected, click on the "Undelete" button on the toolbar.

To completely remove the record, you can open the Recycle Bin and click "Delete selected" or "Empty Recycle Bin" buttons. Once you empty the Recycle Bin, your entries are permanently deleted and there is no way you could get them back.

4 Tools and additional functions

4.1 System tray mode

TK8 Safe has possibility to run in the System tray mode. It means the program is accessible by using (clicking) on its system tray icon, near the system clock:



You can go to system tray mode by using the Tools menu command, or by pressing F12 on your keyboard. Also, if set in options, TK8 Safe can start in the tray mode, or go there automatically when you lock the file or minimize the program.

When you click on TK8 Safe tray icon, the menu appears from where you can use Auto-Type and Run commands. Also you can lock and unlock the program.

To restore main window mode (for example to add or edit entries), open the system tray menu and select "Restore". Also, you can press TK8 Safe system wide hotkey on your keyboard (by default CTRL+ALT+S) from any window to bring up the program.

4.2 Password bar mode

Password Bar is a small window to work with your passwords. It is always on top, so whatever other Windows program you are using, TK8 Safe password bar is visible on top of it. To switch TK8 Safe to the Password Bar mode, click F11 on your keyboard or use Tools menu on the Main window.



In the Password Bar mode you can access all login, card and serial number entries.

You can also change the position of this small window. For this, click on the Password bar and hold the button down until you move it to the place you like. After the position is ok, release the mouse button.

Using password bar

When you need some password or user name, click on the password bar white edit box and start typing the account name. The dropdown menu appears where you can see the closest match. Click on the appropriate entry once you see it. After clicked, the entry name is seen on the edit box.

If you did a typing mistake, you can use Backspace button on your keyboard to "delete" letters you typed.

Another way to select the required entry is to click on the dropdown button directly, without typing the account name.

By clicking the "..." button at right you can access the commands menu. There you can select to copy or auto fill field values of selected entry, add new or edit current entries. You can also lock the file and switch back to the main window mode.

4.3 Password generator

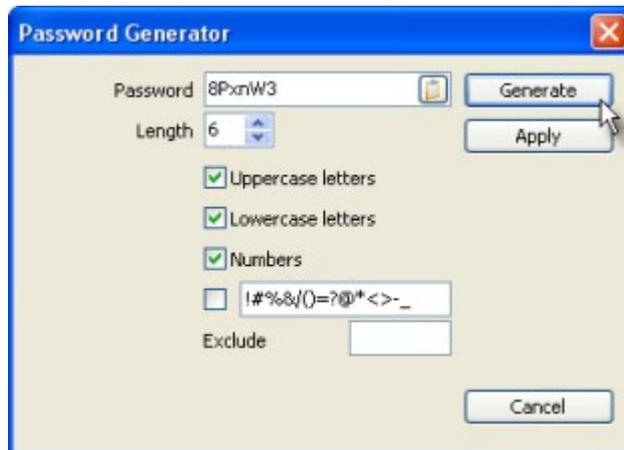
Password generator is a small utility included to TK8 Safe to generate new secure passwords. With a click of a mouse you can generate new random passwords. Random passwords are good because they are impossible to guess.

When you are adding new entries, password generator always fills in the password field with a random password. This automatic behaviour can be turned off when you open the Tools menu, Program Options, and from the "Other" panel check the option box "Turn off automatic password generation when adding new entries".

If you would like to change the password with a new random password, you can just replace it with your own password, or start the generator to create a new password. To start the password generator, click on the icon at right on the password field:

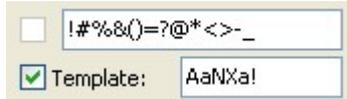


If you want to generate some password unrelated to the entry, you can open password generator also from the main window, using the Tools menu.



Soon the password generator is opened, a new random password is created automatically. If you want to create a new one, you can do this by clicking on the "Generate" button. You can also set the length and what type of characters it should contain (like numbers, special characters, upper and/or lower cases etc).

In the Professional version the program has an additional edit field "Template" available on Password Generator window:



If the template option is checked, the program will generate a new password based on the characters found on this field. The following character "translation" will apply:

- **A** - random upper case alphabetic (A to Z)
- **a** - random lower case alphabetic (a to z)
- **N** - random numeric value (0 to 9)
- **X** - random alpha-numeric value (A to Z, a to z, or 0 to 9)
- **!** - random character

If you want to exclude some characters from appearing in your password(s), enter that character to the Exclude edit box.

The generated password can be copied to clipboard - for this click on the clipboard button at right on the password edit box. When the generator is started from the entry form, the password can also be applied to the entry. For this click on the "Apply" button.

To close password generator click on the "Close" button.

4.4 Favorites, File Summary

Favorites

If you have a lot of entries in some particular folder, but are using only few of them more often, you can use Favorites. Favorites is a list of your entries you have marked as favorite entries.

On the entry list, to mark the selected entry as a favorite entry, open the Favorite menu, and select "Add to favorites".

To see your list of favorites, click on the "Favorites" tab name at the bottom of your screen, or open the View menu and select Favorites. You can use all the normal entry commands. The only difference is that the list is shorter, and contains only records you have marked as favorite entries.

To remove some entry from the favorites list, select it there, and from the Favorites menu select "Remove ...".

To switch back to the normal mode, open the View menu and select Entries.

If you are not using the Favorites functionality, you can hide the Favorites tab at the bottom of your screen and the menu item. To hide, open the Program Options, Appearance panel, and uncheck the Favorite functionality options.

File Summary

File summary is the function that will tell you how big is your file in size, how many folders and entries you have (total and by folders). Additionally, it will tell you how many entries you have in the Recycle Bin.

You can switch to the Summary view from the View menu. To switch back to the normal mode, open the View menu again, and select Entries.

4.5 Importing, exporting and printing

Importing entries

Import function will help you when you have a list of password entries outside of TK8 Safe and you would like to see them inside your file.

To import external file content to your TK8 Safe password database file, the import file has to be in the TAB delimited text file format. If you do not know anything about file formats, you can try to open the file in Microsoft Excel for example. Once your content is seen there, use the "Save As" command and select the file type "Text file (tab delimited)" before saving. Once you have saved the file that way, you can close it.

Please note - the first row in the import file has to contain column (field) names.

Once the import file is ready, you can start the import. Before, though, you have to decide to which folder you would like to add those imported entries. You can create a new folder for this, or select some of your current folders. The folder currently selected is the folder where the entries are added from the import file.

Now, to start importing, open the File menu and select Import. After you select which file to import, import details window appears. There you can see the columns and information found in the file.

Next you have to set destination fields for the columns you want to import. To do this, please click on each column header and select the field where you want to save that information.

Once columns are set, click the "Import" button. When done, the Import window is automatically closed, and you should see the entries that were imported.

Exporting and printing your entries

In case you need to use your sensitive information outside of TK8 Safe, in some other file format, or a "hard copy" on paper, you can use the Exporting command for this. Please be careful with exported files as they are not protected and can be opened by other users having access to your computer or to the exported file.

Before you start exporting, please select the folder from where you want to export the entries. Once the folder is selected, open File menu to select "Print and Export" from there.

On the appearing window you can select what you would like to export - only the selected entry or all entries from the selected folder. Next you can select the output format:

- Print to printer
- MS Excel (XLS)
- Text file (tab delimited)
- HTML file
- XML file

After the format is selected, you can start by clicking the Export button. When you selected the file format, you will be asked for a file name used for your exported entries. When the "Print to printer" was selected, the program will start printing to the default printer you have.

4.6 Send to

From the File menu, "Send to" submenu commands are available. It has three options:

1. Portable device

By selecting this option you can port the program and your file to the portable devices like USB Memory sticks, flash cards, external hard drives, etc. Once sent there, you can start using the program from the portable device directly, in addition to your local copy. That way you can always carry the program and the file with you.

2. Desktop shortcut

By using the Desktop Shortcut option, a new icon is created to your desktop, pointing to your file. It allows you to start the program and open the file automatically (of course, the password is required). If you have working with only one file, that option has no much use, as the recent used file (your only database file) is opened anyway. But if you have several files you work with, you can create shortcuts to your desktop for all of them. And instead of starting the program and selecting the file to work with, you can just double-click on the appropriate desktop shortcut.

3. Mail attachment

If you need to send the file as mail attachment (for example as a backup copy to your own mail account), you can do this by selecting this option from the "Send to" menu. This command will create a new email with your default mail program, and will attach it to there, so you could send it easily.

4.7 Working from portable (USB) devices

When using TK8 Safe, you can take the entire program and your file with you on the portable device (like USB memory keys, flash cards, external hard drives, etc.).

First, still, you need that the program is installed to your local computer. Once you are in need to put the program to the portable device, run the program (from your local computer) and open the File menu. Under the "Send to" submenu select "Portable device". The appearing window allows you to specify what files you would like to port to your device.

You have the following options available:

1. Currently open database file
2. The program itself
3. Help file
4. Registration info

For example, if you want to keep the space acquired by the program minimal, you can left out the help file and thus save some space on the device.

Registration info option is available only when you already have the program registered. When the registration info is ported to the device, and you run the program from there, it is running in the registered mode for the time you work on that computer. So you can use the full functionality without any limitations.

You also have an option to select the exact target folder on the device you prefer to store the program and your file. For this click the Select button. Additionally, when the option "Put all file to TK8 Safe sub folder" is checked, additional folder is created (if it doesn't exist yet) under to the selected location.

After you click the "Start" button, your data is in two locations (your local computer AND the portable device). So you should decide from which location you start working with your data and which file you keep as a secondary file. The problem might arise when you add one entry to the file on the portable device, and the other entry to your local file. In such situations the synchronization feature (available in the Professional version) will help, though, to keep both files the same.

If you prefer to keep the entire and latest information on the portable device, you can just start using the program from that location all the time and in such case you have no need to synchronize files nor think about which file to use.

If you are using the local copy in most cases, and the file is in on the portable device just for case you need it sometimes, you might be in need to refresh that data on the device. For this, just open up the "Send to portable device" window again, and re-send the data to the device. The old data is then overwritten with your fresh, local information.

4.8 Keyboard shortcuts

By default, you can use following key shortcuts with TK8 Safe:

System wide keys

- Ctrl + Alt + S Hot key to activate TK8 Safe whatever other program you are currently running
- Ctrl + Alt + A Hot key to call Auto-type command for filling login information on the currently active page
- Ctrl + Alt + R Hot key to select and launch the link related to some entry

Main window

- Ctrl + N To create a new TK8 Safe file
- Ctrl + O To open TK8 Safe password database files
- Ctrl + P To start sending the program and your file to the portable media
- Ctrl + Z To undo the recent action
- Ctrl + L To lock or unlock the file

- Ins Adds a new entry to your file
- Del Deletes the selected entry

- Ctrl + R To Run the link related with selected entry
- Ctrl + A To Auto-type the previously active page with selected entry information
- Ctrl + U Copy user name of selected entry to the clipboard
- Ctrl + C Copy the password of selected entry to the clipboard
- Shift + Del Clears the clipboard

- Ctrl + M Calls for "Mail entry on template" command.

- Ctrl + F / F3 Advanced Find dialog / Find next
- Ctrl + H Hide (mask) password values

- F12 Go to system tray mode
- F11 Go to password bar mode

- Ctrl + G Starts password generator
- Ctrl + W Starts Web browser

- F1 Press to open the help file

Other standard key shortcuts:

- Up, Down, Left, Right To navigate on the entry list
- Enter To open entry forms and to confirm selections
- Esc To cancel the changes and close forms

5 Features in the Professional version

5.1 Multi-user support

Professional version allows you to connect multiple users to the same database at the same time. That includes multiple sessions by the same user (for example if the same file is opened with two program instances). All users will get the full (not only a read-only) access to the file.

When one user changes the database, others will see the change immediately (after they have changed the folder, or done some changes in the database).

The program has built in record level locking, protecting that different users can overwrite others changes without knowing. If both users are changing the entry, then the first one who saves, will succeed. The other user, should he decide to save the changes, will get the error message saying that during the time they entered the change, the record has been modified already and thus the change cannot be made. Once the database is refreshed, and the second user will see the change that the first user did, but still wants to change the entry, he can then open the entry window again to make and save the change.

5.2 User permissions

Built in user permission system allows you to create separate user accounts for your file and restrict access for those users. You can have folder, entry and feature based restrictions.

To set up and manage users, please open File properties from the File menu. To add, edit or delete users, use the "Users & Permissions" panel. On the user list you will see the user account name and the last login.

When adding or editing user account, the user account details window is on the screen. On its "User information" panel you can enter the account a name and set the password. Additionally you can set a hint to recall the password if the user should forget it.

On "Access to information" panel you can restrict the possibility to access some data. For each entry type (like logins, cards, serial numbers) you can set different permissions. You can show the user all entries, or only those they have created. You can also enable or disable adding new entries. When setting editing and deleting permissions, you can select if the user can delete/edit all entries, those created by this user only, or is the feature completely disabled.

To limit access to some particular folder(s) only, you can check those folders on the right aligned folders list box.

The "Maintenance & Usage" panel allows you to set which features the user can access. By default all features are enabled. To disable some (for example auto-typing), you can uncheck those check boxes.

5.3 File Synchronization

File Synchronization feature available in the TK8 Safe Professional version will help you to merge information from two files into one database.

Though the best strategy to use the "latest version" of your data is to use the database directly the USB drive (memory stick), this option is not always available. If you change the database in one computer, and then another, the data you have on both files is different. To "merge" the changes from those two files, you can use File Synchronization.

Let's say you have a database file A in your laptop and a database file B on your desktop. If you are behind a desktop, you can Synchronize your file with the laptop database file, to import all new and edited entries from the file A.

You should know that not all changes are synchronized (like deleted entry information). If you have deleted an entry from the file A, that entry is not deleted automatically in file B while the databases are synchronized. This is both for security reasons and to avoid logical conflicts. For example, if the program finds an entry from the File B that does not exist in file A, the program can't decide if it is a new record added to your desktop file, or is a record deleted from the laptop. In both situations the record exists in one file but not in another. That is why records are not deleted automatically during the synchronization.

Also, the synchronization does not replace your original source file with the synchronized one. Again, this is for security reasons, meaning you can access the unchanged source data until you want. After you have synchronized the database on your desktop, and want to access the same database on your laptop, you have to copy the database file back to the laptop manually (or use File menu, Save As command). You can also keep using the old laptop database until you want, and synchronize it from time to time with your desktop database.

To start synchronization, please open File menu and select "Synchronize...". On the appearing window you can select the file from where you want to import changed and new entries. Of course, you have to enter the password for that database. Once the file is selected and password entered, you can click the Start button, which will start the synchronization process. During the synchronization you will see the progress until it's done. After completed, you can close the synchronization window and can immediately see the changes in your database (if there were some changes).

5.4 Login Groups

You can form groups from your entries. This simplifies launching several entries with one mouse click.

For example if you would like to check out some statistics on different web sites each morning, you can select the group and run it. For this you can have "Marketing" group for example, and to open each web site entry of that group, click the "Run Group" button on the toolbar. Additionally, you can

access all other entry commands (like copy and auto-type) for the selected group entry, if you want. For the future, we are also planning the "Auto-Type Group" feature, which would automatically fill in the login fields on all pages once they are loaded.

To see your groups and the entries they contain, click on the "Group" tab name at the bottom of your screen, or open the View menu and select Groups. To manage your groups, you can use the Group menu. Under the Organize submenu you can add, edit and delete groups. To switch back to the normal mode, open the View menu and select Entries.

To add some entry to the group, select that entry in the normal entries view mode, and open the Group menu. From the "Add" submenu you can select your group name where that entry should belong to. If you want, you can add one entry to several different groups.

To remove some entry from the group, open the groups view mode, and select the entry you want to remove from that group. Then open up the Group menu and select "Remove from Group".

If you are not using the Groups functionality, you can hide the Groups tab at the bottom of your screen and the menu item. To hide, open the Program Options, Appearance panel, and uncheck the Groups functionality options.

5.5 History log

History log is the place in the program where you can see every entry change made in your file. that includes added entries, changed field values and deleted entries. It can be good in multi-user environments, to see what has happened to some particular entry, or what changes have been made by some particular users.

For this feature to work, please open File properties, Settings panel and see how many changes is set there to keep. Additionally you can specify there which changes you would like to keep in the history log.

When the history feature is active, you can open the File menu and select "History Log" to open the Window. On the appearing window you will see the table with changes. Similar to the main window table interface, you can there sort, filter, and locate entries.

You also have the option to undo some particular action, not only the latest action like with File menu Undo command. You can just activate the row with the change and click on the Undo button on the toolbar to take back that change.

If you don't want to delete some or all actions from the history log, you can do so by using the "Delete" or "Delete All Visible" buttons on the toolbar. If your table has a filter (for example to see entries changed by one particular user only), the "Delete All Visible" button will indeed delete only those entries you see. When you clear the filter later on, and there are other records in the history log with other parameters, they will stay to the history log.

5.6 Templates

In case you want to add specific and the same additional field to a lot of entries, you can use templates for this. With templates, you can add a pre-set number of fields to the entry, with the names and default values as you have specified earlier.

To manage template, open the File menu and select "Organize Templates". There you can add new, edit and delete current templates. When adding or editing template, you can name it and specify which fields it should have. As you can see, you can also change the order of fields with up and down toolbar buttons. Additionally, you can set the option "Auto load" for a template, indicating that you want to add fields and values from this template automatically to every entry that is added in the program.

Now, once you have a template or some of them, you can start loading them to your entries. When you open entry window (add new entry or edit some current entry), then on the "Additional fields" panel you should see the "Templates" button. When you click it, the menu appears from where you can select the template to load to the current entry. Once selected, all the fields and default values are added to your entry. If your entry already contains additional fields, the program will ask if you would like to remove old values or keep them.

5.7 E-mailing entry information

You can access e-mail commands by using the Mail submenu on Entry menu.

Mailing login / entry info

Mailing login or entry info starts the default e-mail program and fills the mail body with information of selected entry. Use this command if you need to send the login (or the full entry) data to someone. If you choose "Mail login info", just account name, user id and password is used on the e-mail. "Mail entry info" will add also additional fields like link, description, notes etc. if not empty.

Mailing on template (Ctrl + M)

By using this command you can send customized e-mails, containing selected entry information inside the e-mail text. After the command is executed, you can select which template file you would like to use. You also have the possibility to pre-set the template filename in the program options, so you would not have to select the file name each time.

Once executed, e-mail is created in your default email program based on the template. you just have to hit the "Send" button to confirm the email sending

Template is a normal text file (created with notepad, for example). The text can contain keys, which will be replaced with entry information. Supported keys for the templates are:

The available fields (keys) and sample template files are included to the TK8 Safe program folder, under the Templates folder.

5.8 Encrypting file

In addition to keep sensitive information, TK8 Safe has built in module for quick file encryption. If the file is encrypted, the information in it is not readable before someone decrypts the file. For decryption, the password is required that was used when the file was encrypted. Without knowing the password, the file remains unreadable forever.

On file encryptions and decryptions the secure AES (Rijndael) 128-bit algorithm is used.

To encrypt a file, open Tools menu and select "Encrypt file" from the File operations submenu.

On the file encryption window please select the file you would like to encrypt. To do this, click on the yellow folder button at right on the edit box. Once selected, you have to select also the destination file name.

Before you can start encrypting the file, you have to enter the password and retype it to the "Confirm password" edit box (to prevent typing mistakes).

When the password is entered, you can start encryption by clicking on the "Encrypt" button or close the window.

Please note that you can decrypt the file only with TK8 Safe, knowing the password that was used for this encryption.

5.9 Decrypting file

In addition to keep sensitive information, TK8 Safe has also built in module for quick file decryption.

You can decrypt files encrypted only with TK8 Safe. Also, password that was used on encrypting the file is required for decryption.

To open Decryption tool, open Tools menu on the main window and select "Decrypt file" from the File operations submenu.

On the decryption window please select the source file you would like to decrypt. For this you can click on the button at right on the field. Once the source is selected, you have to select the destination file name also. You can do this also with the help of a button.

Next you are required to enter the password, and once that is done, you can execute the action by clicking the "Decrypt" button.

5.10 Secure delete

Secure Delete feature is almost the same as deleting the files from your computer normally, except there is no possibility to recover those files later on.

Normally when you delete a file you can recover it later by using Recycle Bin. Or, if the file is deleted from there also, it is still in the hard drive 'out there' and can be recovered with special software.

Secure Delete replaces the information inside the file with random data and deletes the file after that. Once overwritten (and done so several times) there is no sense to restore such file any more by someone, as it does not contain original content any more.

To open Secure Delete, open the Tools menu and select it from the File Operations submenu. Once the window appears, you can select the file and press the "Delete" button. For security reasons you are also asked to confirm the action before the deletion is executed.

To close this window without destroying the selected file, please click on the 'Close' button or hit 'Esc' on your keyboard.

WARNING: ONCE THE FILE IS DESTROYED, YOU CAN NOT ACCESS OR RECOVER THE FILE IN NO WAY ANYMORE

6 Program Options

6.1 General

On the General tab it is possible to set how TK8 Safe should react on basic situations.

"Lock to system tray" option, if checked, will minimize the program to system tray mode when you lock the file.

With "Minimize to system tray" option checked, the program will go to the system tray area when minimized.

If the option "When returning from system tray, always ask the password" is checked, then no

matter if your file is currently locked or not, when you return from the system tray area, you have to know the file password in order to access the program.

By default, when you return from system tray area, the file locking state remains as it is. It means that when your file is locked, it stay's locked, and if it is open, you will see your entries. But if you check the option "When returning from system tray and the file is locked, ask the password", your file password is asked automatically when returning from system tray. And once entered, the lock is removed. In such case you don't have to unlock the file manually to access entries.

"Close to system tray" option prevents the program from closing when checked. Instead of closing, the program will be minimized to system tray mode. It is good in case you want to keep the file and the program open but afraid you will still close it by "accident". This option is ignored on Windows shutdown and in case you use File menu Exit command.

If you are using clipboard commands you might want to clear the clipboard on program exit. For this you can check the option "Clear clipboard on program exit" and it will ensure no sensitive information is left in to your clipboard after the program is closed.

Additionally, you can specify the period after which the clipboard is always cleared. By default your clipboard is cleared after every 5 minutes, no matter is the program used or not.

If you do not use the program for some time, it goes to idle mode. On going to idle mode TK8 Safe can automatically lock your file or close itself. By default the program remains idle after 5 minutes unused, but you can specify this on the current panel. Additionally, you can what the program should do once idle (by default it will lock your file).

If you want to restore default program settings, please click on the Default button at left bottom of the screen. That will reset the settings (applied to all Options panels).

6.2 Startup

On the startup panel you can set different actions to be done on program startup.

At first you can specify which file the program should open. By default, the last used file is opened on program startup. If you want to open a specific file each time, you can select this option and select the file. You can also disable auto opening by selecting "Do not open any file on program startup". Of course, when the file is opened, the master password is always required to open it.

The program can be started automatically on the Windows startup. To do this, you have to check the option "Run the program on Windows startup".

With the option "Expand folders" you can set do you want to expand folders in your file on startup or you would prefer to keep them collapsed.

"Show splash screen" option, if checked, will show waiting screen during the program startup.

On the startup panel you can also select the program state on startup. By default it is started as you left it last time - the size, position, etc. is remembered for the next time. Additionally, you can

select to open the program Minimized, Maximized, or in the System tray and Password bar mode.

6.3 Keys / Auto-Type

System wide hot keys can be used to call different TK8 Safe commands from other programs. TK8 Safe has three system wide key combinations:

- System wide hotkey (default "Ctrl + Alt + S")

System wide hot key will bring up TK8 Safe in case some other program is currently active. If the program is already active, and the option "Lock the program with hot key if active" is set, the file will be locked.

- System wide Auto-Type (default "Ctrl + Alt + A")

If you need to auto type some login information, you can press the Auto-Type hot key in your keyboard. After pressed, you will be asked what entry you would like to use on filling (if you are on that page first time). The connection with that window and the selected entry can be remembered, so next time you press auto-type hot key on that same page, right entry is located automatically and login prompts filled immediately. This is called "Auto-Type Memory". If you want to disable remembering page connections, you can do this by checking the option "Disable Auto-Type Memory for system wide hotkey". If disabled, autofill system wide hotkey will fill the fields with the data of currently selected entry (from Main window).

- System wide Run (default "Ctrl + Alt + R")

Run hot key will open the list of entries and allows you to select which entry link you would like to launch.

In case the file is locked at the moment auto-type or run hot key is pressed, you have to enter the password of your database file at first.

To change hot keys, click on the edit box and press desired key combination.

If you want to submit the auto-typed information automatically after the login prompt is filled, you can check the option "Send additional {ENTER} key press after Auto-Type is complete".

Please note: *If some other program is using the same key combination defined in TK8 Safe, the hot key may not work. In case the hot key is not working, please change it. When changing, TK8 Safe does not allow you to set hot keys already active in your system.*

On this page you will also find the option to automatically lock your file after you have auto-typed the login prompt.

You can also set a delay time between the key strokes sent to the application or the web page. Some web pages do not like when the data is entered too fast. In such cases, you can increase the delay length, so it seems to the page that a real human would type the info in.

6.4 Appearance

On the "Appearance" you can change the look of TK8 Safe.

First, if you want, you can change row colors of your entry list. To change some of the colors, just click on the appropriate edit box and select the color. Additionally, you can specify the color for expired entries. If you want to see entries which will expire soon in different color, you can set the expiration warning period in days and then the color used to display entries that are about to expire.

By default you will see the tab on the bottom of main window entry list to switch between Entries, Favorites, and Groups. To hide this it, uncheck the "Show the bottom tab ... " option.

If you don't want to see the Favorites main menu item, you can hide it by unchecking the option "Show Favorites menu"

If you don't want to see the Groups main menu item, you can hide it by unchecking the option "Show Groups menu"

With TK8 Safe you have a choice of 4 different toolbar styles: XP, Office 11, Standard, Flat. By default, the program uses the XP style.

Check the "Gray scale buttons" option if you do not want to see button colors. Also text position on the buttons can be changed or hidden.

By default the buttons are in the medium size (24 pixels), but this can be changed to large (32 pixels) or to small (16 pixels).

Additionally you can specify where you would like to see the text on the button, or if you would like to hide the text completely.

To customize the buttons you see on the toolbars, right-click with your mouse on the toolbar on the main window and select 'Customize'. After that a standard toolbar customization window will open where you can create new toolbar groups and select / remove buttons on the toolbar groups (by dragging them with mouse).

6.5 Language

On this panel, you can select the program language you want to use in TK8 Safe.

Language support is flexible and allows you to translate the program to any other language that is not currently present in the list. Additionally, you can fix the texts in the current translation if you want to.

To fix or update the translation, click on the "Edit selected" button. That will bring up the translation window.

In case your language is not listed in the selection and you would prefer to use the translated program, you can translate it yourself. Translating is easy and takes only few hours. To add a new language, click on the "Create a new translation" button and enter the language name on the appearing window. After entered, the translation window will appear.

When you edit the translation (or are creating a new one), a translation window appears. First step there is to select the Window from the left panel you would like to translate (section number 1) . After selected, you can select the value on the "Original" panel (section 2) and translate the value at the bottom of the screen (section 3). When the sentence or word is translated, hit the Save button and select another one you want to translate. You can also hit the Enter key on your keyboard, which will save the translation and selects the next phrase for translation.

If you translate the program to your local language, please send the translation to us also, so we could include it with next releases. To create a backup file from your translation, click on the "Back up to desktop". After that a small file is created right to your desktop. To send it to us, attach it to the email and send to support@tk8.com . If you translate the program to the new language, we will give you a free license key with lifetime updates.

6.6 Other

By default, all the changes you do in the file, will be saved automatically. This feature can not be turned off since the version 3 due to security reasons.

It is possible to copy your file to the additional location (folder) after it is closed. To activate this feature, check the option and select the target folder. To select the folder, click on the button at right on the edit box.

By default TK8 Safe will keep 3 backups from your file. So if something happens to your file and it is corrupted (like after virus attack), or you delete the whole file by accident, you can access the latest backup. Automated backups are with the same name, but instead of TKS extension they have extensions "backup1", "backup2", etc. You can open such files directly with TK8 Safe, or, you can remove the "backup" from their name if you want to, before opening them.

If for some reason you want to disable auto backups, just set the field value to 0. To keep more backup, enter the number of backups you would like to keep from your file.

Together with other things, you can set on this panel what action you would like to perform by double clicking on the entry list table. By default double click will open the entry detail form for editing, but this can be changed. For example double click can launch the web site related with entry, perform Auto-Type, copy user name or password, etc.

Another option on this panel is "Turn off automatic password generation when adding new entries". By default, the program will generate a new random password every time you add a new entry. If you don't want to use the default generated password, and prefer the empty field, you can check this option.

Professional version of TK8 Safe has the ability to email login information. This can also be done on

templates. In this panel you can select the template files used to send out emails containing entry data.
